1. Smoking on Campus

Smoking is prohibited on campus except in designated areas!

Tokyo Tech has <u>prohibited smoking on campus except in designated areas</u> since April 1, 2004 in accordance with the National University Corporation Tokyo Institute of Technology Policy for Measures to Prevent Passive Smoking, for the purpose of improving and maintaining the health of members of Tokyo Tech (board members, faculty, staff, and students, etc.) and of promoting the creation of a healthy work place and learning environment.

Accordingly, we have set the basic policies on smoking as follows.

- 1. <u>Smoking is prohibited on campus except in designated areas</u>
- 2. <u>Smoking while walking is prohibited</u> on campus
- 3. <u>Tobacco sales</u> on campus <u>is prohibited</u>
- 4. We support anti-smoking education

Smoking while walking is prohibited!

The latest decisions:

It has also been decided that smoking inside buildings (including laboratories) is prohibited.

On Ookayama Campus, at the 10th meeting of the Ookayama Campus Health and Safety Committee held on January 22, 2010 (AY 2009), all members of the

committee agreed to prohibit smoking on campus except in designated areas. Also, on Suzukakedai Campus, at the 11th meeting of the Suzukakedai Campus Health and Safety Committee held on March 5, 2010 (AY 2009), it was announced that smoking inside buildings is prohibited (smoking in rooms of any laboratory or experimental labs is prohibited, smoking while walking is prohibited, smoking except in designated areas is prohibited) in accordance with the Kanagawa Prefectural Government Ordinance on Prevention of Exposure to Secondhand Smoke in Public Facilities that came into effect on April 1, 2010. However, smoking is allowed as exceptional cases when deans and directors (i.e., individuals who are in charge of the management of buildings) give permission to smoke and that people do so under their supervision and in smoking rooms equipped with smoke dischargers, etc.
