Registering Your Motorbike

All motorbikes that are used on campus **must be registered.**

Illegally parked motorbikes and motorbikes without registration will be clamped or **impounded** (moved to temporary storage).

Read the following guidelines for registration and follow the correct procedures and rules.

How to Register Your Motorbike

- Go to "Bicycle, Motorbike Registration" on the "Web System for S&F" Step 1 Select "Web System for S&F" through the Tokyo Tech Portal (http://portal.titech.ac.jp/) Select "Registration" from the menu. The website provides detailed step-by-step information for registering your motorbike. Be sure to read through the site carefully.
- Please bring your "Student ID" and one of any certificate "a.vehicle Step 2 inspection certificate", "b.registration certificate (certifying acquisition license plate)","c.light vehicle registration certificate" to of your the following window after 1:30 p.m. on the next day of your registration. Excludes Saturdays, Sundays, public holidays, summer holidays, and New Year's holiday Attention: Registration stickers for AY2025 can be picked up from 1:30 p.m. on April 3.

Step 3 Affix the registration sticker on your motorbike in a highly visible location (e.g. mudguard)

You will need to re-register your motorbike in April of the following academic year if you wish to continue using it.

Complete your registration without delay

Unregistered motorbikes will be clamped or impounded.

Basic Guidelines

1. Affix your registration sticker visibly on your motorbike.

Motorbikes without a registration sticker will be clamped or impounded. Owners of motorbikes that have been impounded may be charged a removal fee.

2. Park your motorbike in the designated parking areas only.

Clamping, impounding and de-registration of motorbikes parked outside the designated parking areas will be strictly enforced.

Any motorbike owner found to be in violation of campus traffic rules (not complying with street safety or parking rules) will have his/her motorbike clamped or impounded, and his/her motorbike will be de-registered.

- **3. Your motorbike registration will be valid until the end of March each year.** Remember to re-register your motorbike if you wish to continue using it the following year.
- **4. Do not use the Institute's parking areas as your own personal garage.** Motorbikes found to have been left in the parking areas for two days or longer will be clamped or impounded.
- 5. Do not put a cover over your motorbike while parking it on campus as this will hinder registration checks.
- 6. Do not abandon motorbikes that are no longer needed on or around campus, especially after graduating.

Should a motorbike be found to have been abandoned on or around campus, the owner will be identified and may be charged clamping, removal and/or disposal fees.

7. Other

Persons responsible for damaging campus property with motorbikes will be charged for repairs. Only one motorbike per person can be registered. For more information on using motorbikes, see the Disaster Preparedness and Traffic safety Section
